Project Update

All 31 turbines have been installed and are ready to generate clean electricity. Comprehensive testing continues as part of the complex grid connection process. The turbines are tested in a variety of conditions and their response is recorded and analysed by the Australian Electricity Market Operator (AEMO). Results of testing performed to date using ten wind turbines has been very positive. AEMO also analyses our computer models of the wind farm. These models predict how the entire electricity network would react in certain conditions, such as different levels of supply and demand for electricity and various weather conditions. At the moment, we are working with Goldwind, our turbine supplier, to fine tune the computer models. We expect more turbines to be turned on soon so further testing can be undertaken. We'll keep you informed.

Biala Wind Farm TV Reception Program - Applications are Open

The Biala Wind Farm TV Reception Program is open and proving popular with local residents. The program recognises that local TV reception has been unreliable since before the Biala turbines were installed. The program aims to improve reception across the area and is available to local homes whether or not their reception has been affected by Biala Wind Farm. Biala Wind Farm Landscaping Program - Applications are Open

Applications for our Landscaping Program opened in April 2021. This program was designed to comply with conditions of our development approval. The program allows eligible residences inside 4km of the wind farm to choose from two mitigation options. Further details, including how to apply, are available from the project website. The program is open until August 2024.

Update on the Biala Wind Farm Community Enhancement Fund

Biala Wind Farm will contribute more than \$90,000 (index-linked to increase with inflation) into a Community Enhancement Fund, which will support local projects and initiatives throughout the wind farm's operating life. Similar to the Gullen Range Wind Farm Fund, this Fund will be administered by the Upper Lachlan Shire Council. Council has appointed two community members who will join council representatives and one representative from Biala Wind Farm on the Section 355 Committee. Following the committee's first meeting in June, the next steps are to agree a charter to govern the Fund's operation and set an opening date for the first round of applications. About the Project

Biala Wind Farm is located approximately 6km south of Grabben Gullen on Grabben Gullen Road. It is owned by BJCE Australia, which also owns Gullen Range Wind Farm and Gullen Solar Farm. Biala Wind Farm was awarded a Development Consent in April 2017 by the NSW Planning Assessment Commission and consists of 31 wind turbines. The wind farm connects to the electricity grid via underground electricity cables from the Gullen Range Wind Farm substation at Bannister. Construction started in August 2019 with full operation expected later this year.
