For the first three years of operation (2021–2023), community projects within a 5km radius of Biala Wind Farm will be the main funding priority for the Community Fund. This year's funding round is the final opportunity for priority funding.

## Seven Groups Share in Gullen Range Fund 2023/24 Community Fund

Seven community groups in the Upper Lachlan Shire will benefit from a combined \$72,399.54 in grants from the Gullen Range Wind Farm Community Fund for 2023. The grants were assessed by the Gullen Range Wind Farm Community Fund S355 Committee and were approved in the June 2023 Ordinary Meeting of Council.

The grants will help to fund the following projects:

- 1. Anglican Church Parish St Bartholomew's Church \$24,847 for the **supply** and installation of solar panels
- 2. Anglican Church Parish St George's Church \$7,282 for **removal of dangerous trees**
- 3. The Australian Agricultural Centre \$10,000 for the Sheep Week 2023 event
- 4. Breadalbane Hall Committee \$1,000 for a stick vacuum cleaner
- 5. International Women's Day 2024 \$3,500 for a Women in Agriculture event
- 6. Southern Tablelands Group 12 \$14,549.54 for iPads for the RFS officers
- 7. Upper Lachlan Landcare Inc. \$11,121 for building biodiversity skills

## Planting the Next Generation of Paddock Trees Thanks to Biala Wind Farm

Over 400 native trees have been distributed to 18 properties in the Gunning region this year, thanks to Gunning District Landcare and a \$20,000 Biala Wind Farm Community Fund grant.

Building on the success of its 2022 project, Gunning District Landcare applied for the community grant to extend their tree planting initiative. Landholders were offered 1–50 trees per property, with weedmats and guards, and these were quickly taken up.

Protecting new paddock trees from stock and other animals is the key to success. Part of the grant was used to purchase rolls of tough steel mesh. A working bee on Saturday 13th May saw participating landholders come together for a community working bee to cut up the steel, and collect their guards, seedlings and weed mat. It was a great opportunity for like-minded landholders to meet one another. The Eucalypt seedlings they will plant were propagated by the Yass Landcare Nursery.
